

NEW RENOVATORS LEAD SAFETY TRAINING



Avoid Fines up to \$37,000

As a contractor, you play an important role in helping to prevent lead exposure. Ordinary renovation and maintenance activities can create dust that contains lead. By following the lead-safe work practices, you can prevent lead hazards. On April 22, 2010, new environmental laws went into effect and they affect the remodeling plans of anyone who owns a home built prior to 1978 -- April 22, 2010, federal law will require you to be certified and to use lead-safe work practices.

This one day workshop is designed to teach compliance with Renovation, Repair and Painting (RR&P) rule in Section 402(c)(3) of the Toxics Substance Control Act (TSCA). This new Federal Regulation is intended to protect children and adults alike during renovation, repair and painting projects in pre-1978 housing and in pre-1978 child-occupied facilities, such as daycare centers, where lead-based paint will be disturbed by the work. This act establishes requirements for training and certifying renovations; renovation work practices; and for recordkeeping.

The Education Environmental Associates has received accreditation from the US Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) to present this new course for renovators conducting renovation, repairs or painting in housing built before 1978. This certification is required for all home improvement that disturbs more than 6 square feet of interior, or 20 square feet of exterior lead paint, or presumed lead paint effective April 22, 2010.
